Independent Auditor's Report

To the Members of Alankit Technologies Limited

Report on the standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Standalone financial statements of Alankit Technologies Limited ("the Company") which comprises the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2019, the Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income) and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2019, and profit/loss, (changes in equity)ⁱ and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

- 1) (a) The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars, including Quantitative details and situation of fixed assets;
 - (b) The Fixed Assets have been physically verified by the management in a phased manner, designed to cover all the items over a period of three years, which in our opinion, is reasonable having regard to the size of the company and nature of its business. Pursuant to the program, a portion of the fixed asset has been physically verified by the management during the year and no material discrepancies between the books records and the physical fixed assets have been noticed.
 - (c) The title deeds of immovable properties are held in the name of the company.
- 2) (a) The Management has conducted the Physical verification of Inventory at reasonable intervals.
 - (b) The Discrepancies noticed on physical verification of the inventory as compared to books records which has been properly dealt with in the books of account were not material.

Alankit Technologies Limited Note 1. Significant Accounting Policies

a. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statement

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis under the historical cost convention as a going concern, in accordance with Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). The company has prepared these financial statements to comply in all material respect with the accounting standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules, 2016 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statement are consistent with those of previous year, except for the change in accounting policy

b. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost of acquisition, inclusive of inward freight, duties & taxes and incidental expenses related to acquisition and are net of CENVAT credit. In respect of major projects involving construction, related preoperational expenses form part of the value of the assets capitalised.

c. Intangible Assets

Intangible Assets are recognized only if it is probable that the future economic benefits that are attributable to assets will flow to the enterprise and the cost of the assets can be measured reliably. Intangible assets are recorded at cost and carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any.

d. Depreciation

Depreciation on fixed assets is calculated on written down value method in accordance with schedule II of Companies Act, 2013 as amended from time to time.

e. Employees

Company's contribution to defined contribution schemes is charged to the profit & loss account on accrual basis.

f. Inventories

Inventories are valued at cost (FIFO) or market value whichever is lower.

g. Taxation

Provision for Income Tax is based on assessable profits of the company as determined under the Income Tax Act, 1961.

h. Deferred Taxation

Deferred taxation is provided using the liability method in respect of the taxation effect arising from all material timing differences between the accounting and tax treatment of income and expenditure which are expected with reasonable probability to crystallize in foreseeable future.

Deferred tax benefits are recognized in the financial statements only to the extent of any deferred tax liability or when such benefits are reasonably expected to be realizable in the near future.

i. Revenue Recognition

Revenue from Sales are net of sales tax, rebates & trade discount. Services are recognized as and when such services are

j. Income from Investments/Deposits

Income from investments/deposits is recognised on accrual basis pro-rated to the period Investment has been held taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable and credited to revenue in the period/year in which it accrues. Income is stated in full with the tax thereon being accounted for under income tax deducted at source.

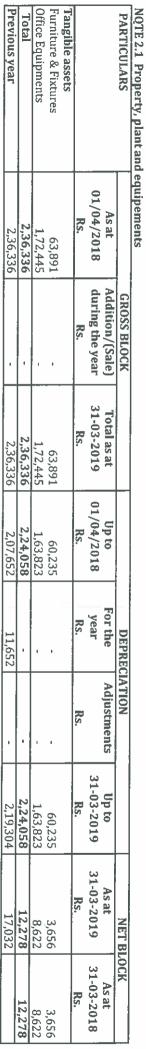
k. Earning Per Share
